AVIATION ORDNANCE MUSEUM DEDICATED

The Aviation Ordnance Museum was officially dedicated on Friday March 2, 1990 in honor of Lieutenant (retired) John W. Finn, Medal of Honor recipient from World War II. Finn is the only Aviation Ordnanceman to be given this award. He was awarded the medal for his actions of gallantry during a Japanese air attack while he was stationed at Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii, on Dec. 7, 1941. Finn bravely returned enemy aircraft fire from the ground position he held.

Dedication ceremonies began with parading of the colors by the Naval Air Technical Training Center (NATTC) Color Guard and music by the Navy Band. Opening remarks were given by Capt. T.W. Finta, commanding officer, NATTC, followed by his introduction of Finn to the audience of approximately 200.

Finn recalled the infamous day that began World War II for the United States and set the stage for his attainment of the Medal of Honor. He pointed out that for some Medal of Honor recipients, the medal is a heavy one, but that he had not experienced this feeling. He stated that he was only one of probably one thousand that should have shared the medal with him on that day.

During his presentation, Finn asked if there were any of his old shipmates in the audience. Unfortunately there were none, but he went on to introduce a good friend that made the event,

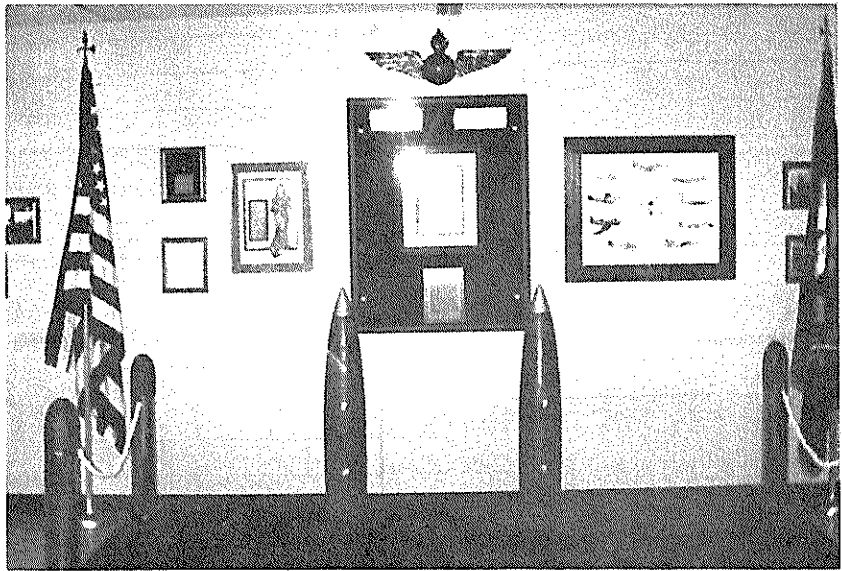

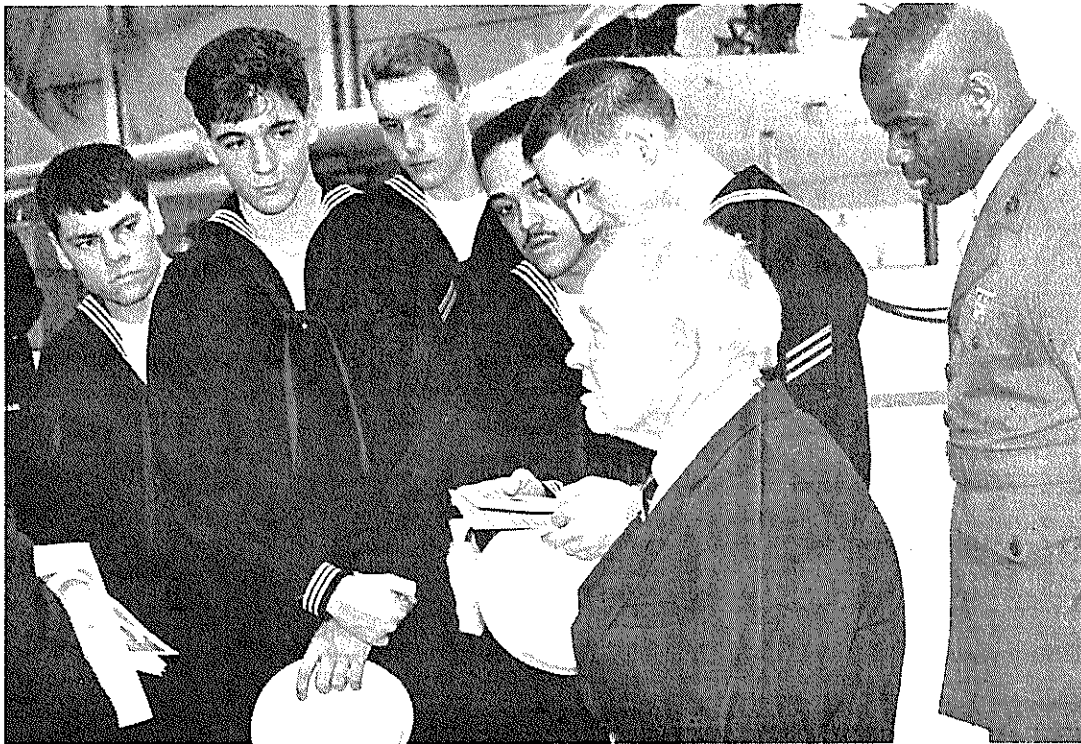
Following the presentations, a cake-cutting ceremony was held to begin the refreshments portion of the day's activities.

He was delighted to speak to the guests, staff and students.



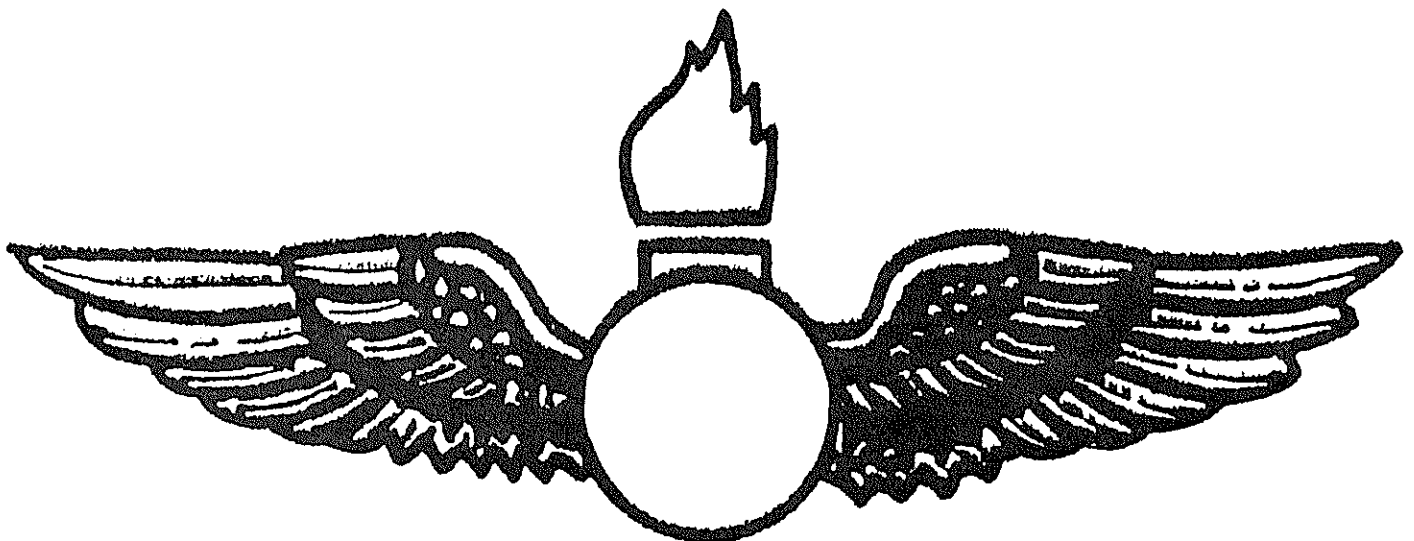
