

The cover of the June 2014 Red Shirt suddenly took me back to when I was the "G" Division Officer on the Kitty Hawk when that picture was taken in 1972. "G" division personnel built and delivered those bombs to the flight deck.

We deployed in February, a few weeks earlier than scheduled and were extended enough times to make it a ten month cruise and we returned to San Diego in late November.

Due to operational demand, "G" division was on a 12 on 12 off schedule and the guys in the division kept the squadrons supplied through an arduous period. Every three days we had an unrep and those work days were closer to 20 hours long because of the round the clock bombing the squadrons were doing.

Just before Easter we pulled into Subic but due to operational necessity we had to pull out early on Easter Sunday. A lot of sailors were left in Olongapo because the departure was on such short notice. In the ten months of that cruise we were at sea all but 45 days and with three section duty we only had 30 days liberty. The AO's in "G" Division did a phenomenal job that cruise; I can't say enough good things about them. My Leading Chief was Don Clark, an AAO plankowner and the best Chief I've ever known. Virgil Burke, another plankowner, was in charge of the armory, John Rhodes, also a plankowner was our ordnance flight deck officer. In July of that year I tore a muscle in my leg running to a mag when the fire alarm in it sounded. False alarm but I was hobbled up enough that those unrep's were too hard for me to handle. About that time Ed Ashlock, another AAO plankowner reported aboard to be the new "W" Division officer. He wasn't too enthused with that assignment so because of my physical problem and my past experience in the Nuke business we traded jobs for the rest of the cruise.

I'd venture to say that more AAO plankowners were Hawk vets than from any other command. Tom Robbins, a plankowner was on the Hawk during a previous time. I also am a proud AAO plankowner. Don Clark passed away many years ago and Ed Ashlock passed away in May, 2014 and the few of us plankowners who are still alive are all senior citizens.

# USS Pelelin (LHA-5) Iron Nickel Chapter



"Iron Nickel" All-Up Round Ready

SASEBO, Japan -

The amphibious assault ship USS Peleliu (LHA 5), in coordination with Naval Munitions Command Detachment Sasebo, conducted a three-day ammunition onload while anchored near Command Fleet Activities Sasebo, Aug. 27-29.

While anchored, Peleliu safely took on more than 1,200 pallets of conventional ordnance in support of its mission with the 31st Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU), based in Okinawa, Japan.

"Safety is foremost," said Senior Chief Aviation Ordnanceman Joe Skelton of Peleliu's Weapons Department. "It was very important that we stressed to everyone involved that we are not in a rush. We conducted several safety briefs, checklists and [safety checks] on equipment to make sure we were operating at the safest level possible."

In keeping with Peleliu's excellent safety record, Senior Chief pointed out what it takes to conduct such a large evolution, both efficiently and safely.

"Quality Assurance Safety Observers (QASO) were present at every movement point, whether it was below decks in the cargo holds or in the hangar and vehicle decks, ensuring everyone is following safety precautions," said Senior Chief. "If there was not a QASO present, ammunition did not move, period."

Once the ammunition was onboard, aviation ord-

nancemen onboard Peleliu were tasked with the staging, handling and stowage of more than 900 tons of ordnance.

"To complete a task of this magnitude is really rewarding," said Aviation Ordnanceman 1st Class Brian Hopkins. "When ammunition onloads happen, all of our hard work, dedication and preparation really show. Knowing we played a vital role in the safe and expeditious onload of ordnance in direct support of our mission and getting Peleliu ready to do what we do, is an accomplishment that we will never forget."

The teamwork and coordination between Peleliu's many departments over the course of three days resulted in a successful and safe evolution that moved more than 1.8 million pounds of ordnance to support sustained operations during Peleliu's deployment.


"Our motivation, dedication and attention to detail were proven during the grueling three days of Peleliu's ammunition onload," said Aviation Ordnanceman 3rd Class Darien Phelps. "Everyone played a vital role in the completion of our mishap-free evolution. We truly watched each other's back, kept each other motivated and ensured we all finished as a team."

Senior Chief Skelton stressed the importance of effective communication and planning between all of Peleliu's departments and divisions.

"All of the ship's departments played a role in one form or another," said Senior Chief. "Peleliu came through and worked together like a "Well-Oiled Machine."

Peleliu is on its final regularly scheduled Western Pacific deployment in the U.S. 7th Fleet area of responsibility supporting security and stability in the Indo-Asia-Pacific region before decommissioning early next year.



The Semi-Annual Strike Weapons Maintenance Readiness Review (WMRR), formerly known as the Weapons Readiness Review (WRR) was held, 7-10 July 2014, at MCAS Miramar, CA. 


