# Association of Aviation Ordnancemen 1990 Convention Highlights

The 1990 Association convention/symposium was held at the Imperial Palace Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada, 14 thru 17 June 1990. There was a good turn out for the convention this year, as was evidence by 290 plus people in attendance Friday night for the social and dancing affair, close to 90 members for the General Business Meeting on Saturday 16 June and 240 people for the Saturday night banquet.

It was a busy convention this year starting with the Board of Directors, Committee Chairman and Chapter Presidents meeting on Thursday the 14th. Registration also commenced on Thursday 14 June. Friday the 15th of June the convention moved into high gear. registration continued and the various committees convened; Scholarship Committee chaired by Bob Underwood, John W. inn AVORDY selection Committee chaired by Digger O'Dell and the By-Laws Committee chaired by Dick Wales. The Safety Committee chaired by Joe Manley, met and held their annual Safety related discussions.

Friday evening a no host cocktail gathering with a wide selection of hor d'oeuvres and musical entertainment was arranged by this years Convention Chairman Frank Thill. It was a thoroughly enjoyable event and the sea stories really flew along with the feet of the many dancers.

Saturday morning bright and early the General Business meeting convened. There were in excess of 90 members in attendance. It's hard to get an accurate count because quite a few of the members wander in and out without registering. The meeting commenced with President, LCDR Charles R. Onken, leading the general membership in the pledge of allegiance followed by the Chaplain, Jim Irving, AOCM/Ret, leading the membership in prayer. The President then made come general comments concerning this years Convention. The Secretary/Treasurer read a synopsis of the 1989 General Business meeting minutes, (complete sets of minutes were disseminated to the membership in attendance). After the reading of the synopsis of the 1989 General Business meeting minutes, a motion was made and approved to accept the minutes as distributed.

Committee Chairmen gave their reports; Scholarship by Bob Underwood, Safety by Joe Manley, Frank Thill gave the 1990 Convention report, Vice-President Tom Robins gave the membership report. He stated that renewals are still a problem. Tom also challenged every member to recruit one new member and re-sign a previous member who has let their dues lapse. Dick Wales reported on the By-Laws Committee actions and gave an updated overview of the committee's activities. Dick stated the committee's goals were to do a complete and thorough re-write of all the By-Laws in an attempt to alleviate the problems that seem to keep reappearing with some of the verbiage of individual By-Laws. Dick also stated that the complete rewrite of the By-Laws would be published in an upcoming newsletter to afford members the opportunity to read the revisions prior to being voted on at the 1991 General Business Meeting, LT Mike Taylor presented the status of the 1989 calendar sales. Digger O'Dell reported on the John W. Finn Ordnanceman of the Year. Digger stated there was over 300 years of Aviation Ordnance experience on the Board this year. The President reported on the Association's Hall of Fame award. Chuck said the guidelines that will govern this award had been reviewed. At the present time the Board of Directors comments were being incorporated, and they would be redistributed for another review by the Board of Directors. LT Jeff Sassone, Newsletter Editor, gave the Newsletter report. The President took this opportunity to thank the previous Newsletter Editor AOCS Ed Hammond and Chapter Three for their efforts over the last 2 1/2 years. Chapter reports were then given by Chapters 1, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 12, 21, 41, 65, 68, 70, and "S-87". It was announced that certificates had be re-designed for the Honorary members as well as new certificates for Scholarship awards, AVORDY and AVORDY First Runner-Up being established.

Under new business; A report on the status of registering the Association's Logo and Trademark was provided by the Secretary/Treasurer. The President announced that the Board of Directors had established a policy that in event of death of a member of the Association whose dues were in good standing, the surviving spouse would be offered Honorary Lifetime membership in the Association. He also announced that the Board of Directors had authorized the amount of two hundred dollars to be transferred from the Association's General account to the Association's Scholarship account in the name of Lester B. Tucker, CWO4/Ret, for his contributions to the Association. The Scholarship Committee Chairman announced that a total of \$450.00 had been donated to the Scholarship fund in memory of the late Arthur M. Meekins, AO/Ret.

Elections were then held for the office of Secretary/Treasurer and two positions on the Board of Directors. Newly elected Officers: Robert A. Ashworth, CDR/Ret, as Secretary/Treasurer in place of outgoing Jerry Gannon, Dave Michel, AOCM/Ret, for outgoing Board of Director member Ralph "Digger" O'Dell and AOCS Gary Buse for outgoing Board of Director member Wayne Beasley. A standing ovation for all outgoing Officers was given.

It was announced that George Adams, CWO4/ Ret, had selected John Ascuga's Nugget in Sparks, Nevada as the 1991 convention site.

Saturday evening Two-Hundred-Forty members and guests enjoyed a Prime Rib buffet dinner. After dinner, Captain Louis Robert Canepa, Chief of Staff, Naval Air Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet, gave a very interesting and well received presentation of "Operation Praying Mantis". This operation was conducted while Captain Canepa was "Super CAG" of Airwing 11 onboard the USS Enterprise. The presentation covered quite a few of the new weapons in the Navy Air Arsenal. Weapons that quite a few of the members in attendance were not familiar with.

# Aviation Ordnancemen of Note

In August 1942, at Nazan Bay Aleutians, the

Japanese submarine RO61 torpedoed the USS Casco, the PBY tender. Fuel oil and AVGAS spread over the bay. A Franklin Buoy with automatic pyro flare was floating in the muck AOM J. Cobean dove over the side in water of about 40 degrees, swam to the buoy and held it under water until the flare was exhausted, then swam back to the ship to the cheers of the crew. The sub was severely damaged by a PBY and finished off by the USS Reid.

I have found a lot of knowledgeable people who did not know that we operated an airfield at Attu, the western most island of the Aleutian chain, only 670 miles from the Japanese Islands. The PV Vega Ventura twin engine bombers, were used to bomb, rocket, strafe, and photo recon the base at Parimushiro and on down the island. The ordnancemen in the crew normally operated the top turret and the ASD-1 RADAR, which was immediately beneath the turret. It is believed that these ordnancemen shot down 17 enemy fighters. It is recorded that AOM2 Floyd Jacobsen shot down three in one flight. One squadron had all AQ navigators and they were considered top profes sionals. Another squadron had the peculiar primary mission of flying fighter cover for the B24 and B25 bombers flown by the Army Air Corps, also stationed on Attu.
