

Hey there fellow BB stackers!

I hope everyone is healthy, happy and prosperous. Being part of the best rate in the services, how can we not be, right!?!? We're all gearing up for convention, performing all of the "behind the curtain" efforts in order for all of us to get our business done, recognize and award our stellar performers, and most of all, HAVE A BLAST!

Speaking of convention, make sure you register early. Having accurate attendance numbers, early in the process, allows the Silver Legacy ample time to ensure everything is set up the way we need it. The more people that don't register until they get to Reno, the more work we have to do to update the hotel, which means they have to scramble to accommodate additional tables, chairs, food, etc.... Yes, things happen, but if you know you're going, register now. And remember, everything can be done on the website, redshirtnation.com. As for prices this year, as I stated in the last Redshirt, we were forced to increase costs again. Please understand, we do everything we can to keep costs at the bare minimum. Your Convention Committee Chairmen, Kirk Brado and (now) JJ LaMaitre, talk to the hotel constantly to find ways to reduce or remove costs. That being said, keep in mind, the Association does not pay a dime for any of the meeting spaces or registration room. That's because we've worked with them for so long, and they love seeing us come back every year. So, we could be paying a much higher registration fee (like, a lot) if it weren't for the Legacy showing they're appreciation for everything we do. As always, if there's a way to bring ticket prices down, we'll do it.

He will give you all of the information you need. Also, as with early registration, we need to know how many of you want to have a table BEFORE YOU GET TO RENO!!!! The room is only set up those chapters we know are coming. We even change the size of the room if needed. If you show up wanting a table and haven't talked to Kirk, there's a chance we might not be able to get you one. PLAN EARLY.

Officer Elections – There are (4) Officer positions up for election this year, Vice President, currently held by yours truly,

Secretary, currently held by JJ LaMaitre, and (2) Board of Directors, currently held by Dion Edon and Angela Sobieski. I received nominations for myself for VP, JJ for Secretary and Dion Edon, Angela Sobieski and Niomi Deppe (Chapter 8 President) to fill the (2) Board of Director positions. Anyone that is not going to be able to attend convention this year, and is a member in good standing, can submit an absentee ballot via the website. Again, only submit an absentee ballot if you are not going to attend the general business meeting during convention. If you do submit an absentee ballot, you must not vote for the same nominee for both Board of Director positions. For example, if you vote for Niomi Deppe for BOD #3, do not vote for her again for BOD #4. Any discrepancies noted with the absentee ballots will be cause for rejection. During the general business meeting, there will be a call for additional nominations from the floor. All nominees must be present and accept the nomination. If there are (2) or more nominations for a position, ballots will be cast. If there is only (1) nomination for a position, the requirement for voting is null and that nominee will be elected.

A Proclamation of The City of Ridgecrest, California AVIATION ORDNANCE DAY

WHEREAS, on a date lost in history, a young marine handed a grenade to a pilot who subsequently deployed it during a combat mission in the First World War; and,

WHEREAS, a Chief Gunners Mate, a Chief Turret Captain, and several Mechanics were sent forth to pioneer the Navy's first Advanced Aircraft Armament and Ordnance System in Pensacola, Florida; and,

WHEREAS, The California Grand Jury is an arm of the Superior Court; and,

WHEREAS, on the 2nd day of March, 1926 the United States Navy declared the establishment of the Aviation Ordnance Rating and all four petty officer grades of Chief, First, Second, and Third Class and the Aviation Ordnance specialty mark, a winged flaming spherical shell, was incorporated into the Uniform Regulations in January 1927; and,

WHEREAS, the establishment of the Association of Aviation Ordnancemen in 1976 leading to the first annual convention in San Diego, CA. formally opening membership to all Navy and Marine Corps ordnanceman past, present, and future.; and,

WHEREAS, transferred to the United States Navy in November 1943 by the United States Army Air Forces, at the conclusion of the search for an adequate ordnance testing facility by Charles C. Lauritsen and Sherman E. Burroughs. Naval Ordnance Test Station was founded. Leading to the development of an array of airworthy conventional rockets and missiles to include the AIM-9, SLAM-ER, Tiny Tim Rocket Unit, and much more, Naval Air Weapons Station China Lake has been "the home of ordnance".

Now, Therefore, The Ridgecrest City Council Hereby Proclaims the day of March 2, 2023 as "AVIATION ORDNANCE DAY" and asks all citizens of Ridgecrest to join with the Association of Aviation Ordnanceman's 5th Chapter in carrying the message and recognition of the tasks and hardships carried out and endured by naval ordnance men and women, ordnance handlers, engineers and scientists aboard NAWS China Lake, Air Test & Evaluation Squadron Nine, Air Test & Evaluation Squadron Nine, Air Test & Evaluation Squadron Thirty One, NAWS China Lake Weapons Department, Explosive Ordnance Disposal Detachments and other associated military and civilian components, that have led to the progression and advancement of conventional weapons testing capabilities, ordnance and armament systems, procedures, training, and tactics for the fleet.
