1984 CONVENTION NEWS

The Association of Aviation Ordnancemen held it's ninth Annual Convention on 22-24 June 1984 in Las Vegas, Nevada. The turnout was great and everyone seemed to enjoy themselves. We had 93 members at the General Business Meeting and 164 for dinner and dancing.

The 1984 Convention Committee (Bill Davis & Paul Collins) did an outstanding job in making all the necessary arrangements. WELL DONE. Captain James A. Kenney, Commanding Officer of the Mine Warfare Inspection Group was our guest speaker and gave a very informative presentation.

The General Business Meeting was chaired by our President, Don Baumer and was attended by 93 of our members. Jim Rowe and "Digger" O'Dell were re-elected to the Board of Directors for another three year term. Gerry Gannon was elected to serve as Secretary/Treasurer for a term of three years. CONGRATULATIONS to all the newly elected officers.
