

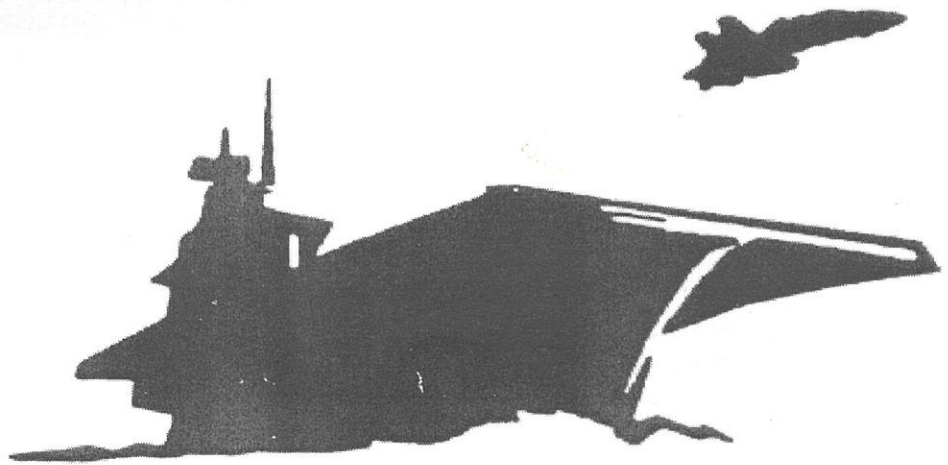
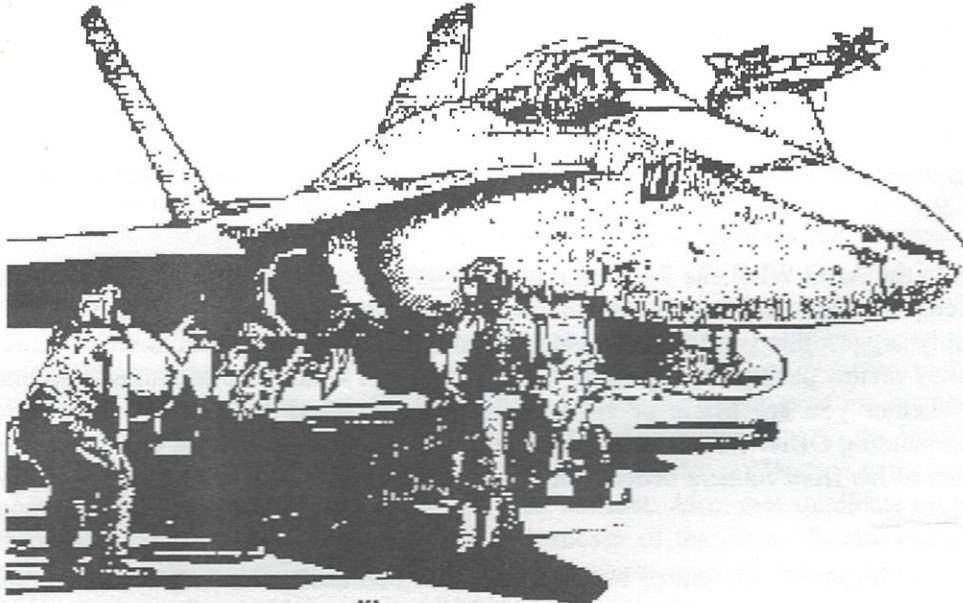

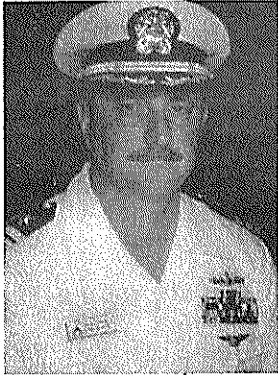

I've just visited the National Museum of Naval Aviation in Pensacola. I'm very confident that we are very close to getting our museum assets moved and displayed there. My visit was well received, so hopefully this action item will soon become a reality. I spent considerable time with the Curator, Mr. Buddy Macon. I also had the opportunity to call on VADM, Ret, John Fetterman, the President/CEO of the museum. The Admiral took time from his extremely busy schedule to see me. Both he and Mr. Macon agree that it's now time to move forward with this issue. Tim Carroll has been debriefed, along with John Sweeney, on my direction and action. The Pensacola Chapter has been very busy cataloging and readying our current inventory for transfer. During the final phase of this project, they will take digital photos of each asset, labeled by what the item is and who donated it to the Associations museum. Once in the hands of the National Museum of Naval Aviation, all items will then be placed on a federal listing, which is required by law for accountability. The Museum will then use our input and technical expertise, coupled with their display staff, to find a location within their facility which will properly and professionally display our pieces of Naval Aviation history. The museum has always been a eye watering display of our nation's war fighting capability, past and present, but there has always been one piece missing. That piece was the ordnance that many of you have spent so many years loading and caring for. If you have any question feel free to email me. I'll be happy to answer them.

As I write our Convention Committee is preparing to meet in Laughlin to select the food and review the facilities at River Palms for this years Convention, 26 - 29 June. With that in mind I would like to remind everyone that the nominations for the positions of the President, two Board of Directors (Ed Scott and Brenda Cotter) and the chaplain are due to me by 15 March 2003. This allows time to place them on the absentee ballot and for publication in the Red Shirt. If you nominate an individual you must first get their consent. Also, that candidate must be present at the annual convention to ensure an orderly turnover of the office. In accordance with the By Laws, absence of a candidate from the General Business meeting requires approval of the Board of Directors for that candidate to be eligible for election. The nomination package shall include a short synopsis of the nominee's background and a statement indicating why the nominee should be a candidate for office. After the candidate's membership status has been verified and eligibility to run for office established, their name will be included on an absentee ballot which then will be published in each Red Shirt. Remember, the publication of nominees on an absentee ballot in the Red Shirt does not preclude the acceptance of nominations from the floor during the annual General Business meeting. All above requirements still remain a requirement when nominating from the floor, (i.e. their consent and a verbal short synopsis of background and why the nominee should be a candidate). If nominating from the floor remember that only the people in attendance of the General Business meeting will have an opportunity to vote for that nominee.

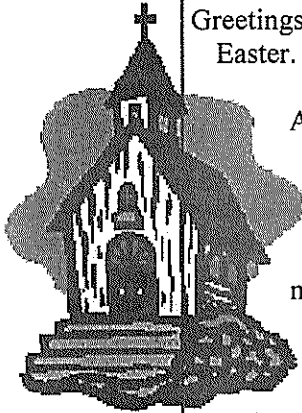

CHINA LAKE, CA



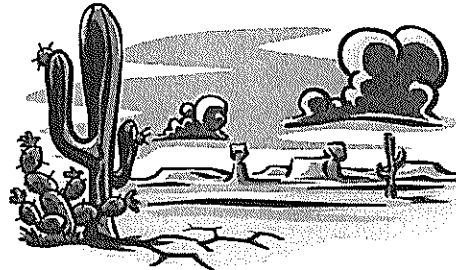

Greetings from the San Diego Chapter.

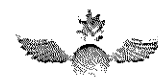
Our Chapter prides itself on our community involvement.
