Reference (a): A letter from Royce Hall, written to the Curator of the Pensacola Aircraft Museum on 20 Mar 2011.

Following Naval Service entry on birthday #17 in 1940, completing boot camp, and Ordnance A School in Norfolk, VA., he had just taken a seat in the base theatre in Pensacola,

FL on 7 December 1941. A minute or so after the movie started the lights came back on, and the Gunnery Officer walked onto the stage and said, "Sailors change from your whites to your dungarees. We are at war with Japan who attacked Pearl Harbor this morning".

Imagine the scene of hundreds of officers and men walking out of the theatre and running to get our work clothes on.

The first thing that happened on day 1, was a Reserve Chief picking Royce and a dozen running mates, to install synchronized guns in old Vultee Vibrator training planes. It took all day and night to get the job done by following instructions straight out of an old Ordnance Manual. After finishing the job, some pilot instructors and gunners tested our handiwork over the 'gulf', firing at a sleeve. Words of pilots shooting holes in a lot of wooden propellers came around. The base Skipper ordered no more firing at target sleeves for fear someone may get killed.

Activity during the first few weeks was absolute chaos as the mood was that the Japanese might attack the US any day. All watches were tripled, the base was closed to visitors, guns were set up and other measures were taken to ready the base for possible sabotage and invasion.

60 of us Ordnancemen taught aviation cadets to fire Colt .45 pistols, 30 cal air cooled machine guns and to hit clay pigeons slung from a trap, so they could hit moving targets. The fuselage of an old Grumman bi-plane was positioned on a stand, so they could learn what it was like to shoot a single .30 cal synchronized gun between rotating propeller blades at another plane or a sleeve.

Most Ordnancemen hated the job, due to having to don fleece lined suits and hand cranking the old relic, while standing in the slip stream, showing Cadets how to shoot at a small revolving target, 26 yards in front of the gun.

This was just the beginning of his six years in the Navy, mostly spent flying combat as a gunner in the Pacific war zones

We did some loads with the MICA, GBU 12, and downloaded 30MM from their A/C gun. We shared sea stories over fresh baked French bread and wine and they talked about how their 3 month deployment got extended to 4 months LOL! Their carrier is a lot different and is smaller than ours but their CO told us that "size doesn't matter" and that they complete the same mission that we do...

Truman (CVN 75) and the French aircraft carrier FS Charles de Gaulle (R 91) began conducting combined flight operations in the U.S. 5th Fleet area of responsibility Jan. 14. The flight operations are part of an ongoing period of overall combined operations between the Harry S. Truman Carrier Strike Group (HST CSG) and French Task Force 473.

As part of combined flight operations, aircraft assigned to Carrier Air Wing 3, embarked on board Harry S. Truman, and aircraft from Charles de Gaulle, have landed on and launched from both aircraft carriers. In addition to launching and recovering on their counterparts' flight decks, U.S. and French pilots have also participated closely together in air defense, a war at sea exercise, and a variety of other operational and training scenarios. HST CSG and French Task Force 473 will continue operating together throughout the month of January to enhance levels of cooperation and interoperability, enhance mutual defense capabilities and promote long-term regional stability.






